Wandsworth / GLL Heritage Awards for Schools 2017

Guidance for entrants

Criteria

Entries should relate to people, places or events that have affected the history and/or social development of Wandsworth making it the diverse and cosmopolitan borough it is today.

Prize categories

Medals, certificates, plaques and a £1,000 cash prize will be presented to the winning school in each of the following Key Stages: KS1 (4-6 years); KS2 (7-11 years) and KS3 (11-14 years).

Expressions of interest

It would help us to know how many entries to expect. To that end, you are asked to email HeritageAwards@wandsworth.gov.uk indicating your intention to submit an entry by

14th November 2016.

Required elements

Projects must be school based and can be either Teacher, School Librarian or volunteer led, with a minimum of 3 pupils participating. Pupils can be from different year groups. ***All work must be original and produced within the last 12 months.***

Each entry must comprise the following elements:

1. An introduction. This should include a brief outline of the project, stating why it was selected and how it relates to the history of Wandsworth.
2. A visual element, which could be art (including drawing or painting); sculpture (including models); or photography. Judges can, if necessary, arrange to view visual submissions.
3. A written element, which could be an essay, short story, poem song, or short play.
4. A conclusion or analysis of findings. This could take the form of typed up notes of a class discussion in the children's own words.
5. A list evidencing use of a variety of research materials and sources detailing how they were used.
6. A completed entry form, authorised by the Head Teacher.
